- 4. Open Forum Capture "what do we want to be" Ideas/concerns from residents
 - a. Traffic Concerns
 - During rush hour, westbound traffic on Gleneagles Drive is now backing up past the entrance of Gleneagles Close.
 - Is there any consideration from the Town restricting Gleneagles Drive to "Local Traffic Only"
 - iii. While there is increased enforcement in Gleneagles targeting speeders, is the town giving any consideration to the construction of "traffic calming measures". Example speed bumps, bump outs at intersections and cross walks, especially near parks, etc?
 - b. Ideas/Concerns Captured from residents during the open discussion

- Gleneagles over the last couple of years has been "reactive" with budget challenges and apathy (lack of volunteers) - suggested that we need a 5 year plan.
- Make decorating the entrances a year round activity, as compared to summer only.
- iii. Could the entrances to East, West and the condos be Xeri-scaped and further reduce if not eliminate irrigation costs?
- iv. There is an entrance sign to all of our communities & Condo association, with the notable exception of Eastbound Gleneagles Drive. The town owns a small pice that they may be open to placing another Gleneagles sign (well received by residents, further asks that could the "local traffic only" concept be included)
- Development of of wildfire risk and communication strategies with the Town. (i.e. a wild grass fire in Glenkew provincial park)
- Sidewalk repairs were noted as ne=ebing needed in many areas. Asks to audience to please notify the Town
- Suggestions were made that perhaps a summer student could be retained to help dewelop a strategic plan and poll the community.
- viii. Asks as to when the next newsletter update will be on the GECA website.
- 5. Resignation & Election of Directors
 - Ron advised again that he is leaving Gleneagles in early July this year and would be unable to continue past the AGM.
 - John White has stepped back and resigned.
 - c. Leanne Jensen had resigned earlier in the year
 - Rodger Grant had volunteered to become a member of the board of Directors. By a show of hands of everyone present this was confirmed.
 - e. There were no nominations nor volunteers for the position of President.
 - It was noted that there is no representation from the Summit of Gleneagles (Condo Association) at this time.
 - g. At the conclusion of the meting, only 7 of 9 board positions were filled, and the role of President was vacant.
- Meeting adjourned at approximately 8:00pm when no one in attendance had any further concerns or ideas to present, and no nominations or volunteers for the position of President stepped forward.

Landscaping Report: 2021


GlenEagles has 13 acres of green space

- At the time that the subdivision was built, GlenEagles maintained all of the parks and green spaces
- In return the ToC reimbursed GlenEagles \$44,000 annually
 - ToC unilaterally reduced this to \$22,000 in 2016 and totally eliminated it in 2017

After the subsidy was eliminated, GlenEagles and the ToC agreed on a separation of duties

 GlenEagles is responsible for the Gleneagles signage and the entrance to Highway 1A, as well as the boulevard entrances to GlenEagles East, West and The Landing

 The ToC is responsible for the parks and islands and agreed to maintain them at the same standard as other communities in Cochrane

- GECA is accountable for areas #5, #12, # 17 and #18
- The Town is accountable for all other areas
- Areas #5 and# 7 —no irrigation in place
- Area #8 no lawn; just mulch
- Area # 11 a.k.a. ravine; intended to be natural

The landscaping areas transferred to the ToC have deteriorated significantly and complaints have escalated

- Common complaints:
 - Grass Cutting uneven, mower too low, areas left uncut
 - Shrub and Tree Beds tree suckers, overgrown, dead
 - Weeds everywhere
 - Irrigation none

The Board realized that the parks and islands were deteriorating to such an extent that we had to act and issued an RFP

- The Landscaping Committee issued an RFP with a focus on pricing and service delivery:
 - 5 companies were approached and asked to quote on 3 possible scenarios; 3 companies provided quotes
- The decision was made to stay with our current provider TJK
- The contract will be re-tendered every 3 years

The Board approved several landscaping projects to augment the ToC's Services

■ In 2020: Signage and boulevard at the entrance to Highway 1A

■ In 2021: Shrub/tree beds on islands – weeding, mulching

■ In 2022: Shrub/tree beds on islands – edging, trimming,

shaping, and culling

 Also in 2022: The Landscaping Committee met with ToC four times and saw some progress



- Ensure irrigation system repairs i.e., ready for use as required by Gleneagles
- Move to more sustainable landscaping at lower cost:
 - Native/Naturalized Plants
 - Mulch

- Reduced Watering
- Reduced Maintenance


